

TOWN BOARD MEETING MINUTES
FROM May 7, 2026, 6:00 PM
HELD AT THE TOWN OF SHEBOYGAN FALLS TOWN HALL

Chairman Lyman Theobald called the Town Board meeting to order at 6:00 PM.

Board members present were Chairman Lyman Theobald, Supervisors Gerald Meyer, Carol Leannah, Jim Hanke and Adam Luebke. Also in attendance were Clerk / Treasurer Jeanette Meyer, State Patrol Sargent Daniel Diedrich, Duane & Tanner Gumm, Kevin Reyer, Scott Ahlswede and Cyndi Kostichka.

COMPLIANCE WITH THE OPEN MEETINGS LAW – Original Notices were posted Thursday, April 30, 2026, at 11:00am at the Town of Sheboygan Falls Town Hall and on the Town's website. Corrected Notices were posted Tuesday, May 5, 2026, at 10:00am at the Town of Sheboygan Falls Town Hall and on the Town's website.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON THESE ITEMS:

a. Consideration of Weight Limit Options for Willow Rd- State Patrol Sargent Daniel Diedrich notified the Town that there is a potential issue with the weight limit signage on Willow Rd. His office has received numerous complaints from Willow Rd resident Scott Ahlswede regarding the truck traffic that traverses Willow Rd to get to Glacier Transit & Country Visions Coop -City of Plymouth businesses also located on that stretch. The Town had it posted as 10 Ton Weight limit & No truck route. Chair Theobald asked him to attend a meeting when all residents in the section could be invited to hear the information.

Officer Diedrich explained as it was posted **ANY** Commercial Motor Vehicle over 10 Tons could receive a citation even if they had deliveries to any property on the section of road. He also expressed the safety concerns of operators backing onto CTH C or HWY 23 after seeing the posting. The signs have been removed pending the Boards decision.

Officer Diedrich offered 3 options:

1. No signage posted – which would allow all traffic to traverse Willow Rd.
2. Post as it was – 10 Ton Weight Limit & No truck Route – which could lead to any Commercial Motor Vehicles facing enforcement.
3. Post as Class B Highway – which gives Commercial Motor Vehicles 60% of the gross weight limit, vehicles are not supposed to use the road as a throughfare only if they have business at a property with a driveway on Willow Rd.

Residents in attendance had varying opinions and were allowed the opportunity to talk even though this was not a public hearing. Officer Diedrich offered to increase patrols on Willow Rd from HWY 23 to CTH C for a period of time and will report back with his findings of effectiveness. He stated that the truck would be allowed to continue to the road after being released from any stop as backing off the road is dangerous. No action taken by the Board.

ADJORNMENT – Motion to adjourn was made by Meyer, seconded by Leannah. Meeting adjourned at 7:06 pm.
